GENERAL CONDITIONS

GENERAL CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATIONAL DESCRIPTION

- G1 The Works Approval Holder shall construct the works in accordance with the works approval application form dated 18 October 2011 and the following documentation:
 - i) Works approval application to construct 3 new wastewater evaporation ponds,
 Shark Lake Food Group, 2 December 2011;
 - (ii) Determination on application for planning approval, application number 10.2011.1861.1, Shire of Esperance, 13 December 2011;
 - (iii) Consolidated addendum to Works Approval for Evaporation Ponds Submitted December 2011, Shark Lake Food Group, 4 January 2012; and
 - (iv) Request to amend WA W5107/2011/1, Shark Lake Food Group, 15 October 2014.

Where the details and commitments of the documents listed in condition G1 above are inconsistent with any other condition of this Works Approval, the latter shall prevail.

DUST – GENERAL REQUIREMENT

G2 The Works Approval Holder shall ensure that dust emitted from construction activities associated with the works detailed in condition G1 does not unreasonably interfere with the health, welfare, convenience, comfort or amenity of any person who is not on the premises.

GROUNDWATER MONITORING BORES

- G3 The Works Approval Holder shall install five (5) new groundwater monitoring bores as part of the works detailed in condition G1, as detailed in attachment 1:
 - (a) Three (3) new monitoring bores as labelled 'New groundwater sampling sites';
 and
 - (b) Two (2) new monitoring bores within the areas labelled 'Additional new groundwater sampling sites required by DER'.
- G4 Upon submission of the works approval compliance documentation for Stage 1 required by condition G5 the Works Approval Holder shall submit initial groundwater monitoring sample results. The groundwater monitoring sample results will meet the specifications required by licence condition 3.1.1 for groundwater monitoring bores under L7294/1998/11 as issued 17 October 2014.

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1 Purpose of this document

This Decision Document explains how DER has assessed and determined the application for a works approval or licence, and provides a record of DER's decision-making process and how relevant factors have been taken into account. Stakeholders should note that this document is limited to DER's assessment and decision making under Part V of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986.* Other approvals may be required for the proposal, and it is the proponent's responsibility to ensure they have all relevant approvals for their Premises.

Works approval and licence conditions

DER has three types of conditions that may be imposed on works approvals and licences. They are as follows:

Standard conditions

DER has standard conditions that are imposed on all works approvals and licences regardless of the activities undertaken on the Premises and the information provided in the application. These are included as the following conditions on works approvals and licences:

Works approval conditions: 1.1.1-1.1.4, 1.2.1, 1.2.2, 5.1.1 and 5.1.2.

Licence conditions: 1.1.1-1.1.4, 1.2.1-1.2.4, 5.1.1-5.1.4 and 5.2.1.

For such conditions, justification within the Decision Document is not provided.

Optional standard conditions

In the interests of regulatory consistency DER has a set of optional standard conditions that can be imposed on works approvals and licences. DER will include optional standard conditions as necessary, and are likely to constitute the majority of conditions in any licence. The inclusion of any optional standard conditions is justified in section 4 of this document.

Non standard conditions

Where the proposed activities require conditions outside the standard conditions suite DER will impose one or more non-standard conditions. These include both premises and sector specific conditions, and are likely to occur within few licences. Where used, justification for the application of these conditions will be included in section 4.

3 Executive summary of proposal and assessment

Shark Lake Food Group Pty Ltd (SLFG) has held a licence to operate an abattoir, fellmongering and rendering facility since 1998. The Premises was not constructed through a works approval. The licence was transferred to the current occupiers SLFG in April 2008. The abattoir processes a mix of stock including beef, goat and sheep and has an approved processing capacity 7,350 tonnes live weight (LW) per annual period.

Effluent generated is discharged to a pond-based wastewater treatment system which treats effluent to a primary standard. Treated effluent is disposed of through evaporation from an existing evaporation pond, Pond 6 (referred to as Pond 11 in previous versions of the SLFG works approval and licence) that has an average annual evaporative capacity of 6ML.

Key issues associated with operation of the facility include effluent management, waste management, smoke and odour emissions. DER notes that the Premises infrastructure is old and not ideally located. DER's assessment of the water balance for the Premises, accounting for holding and evaporative capacity of existing treatment and evaporative ponds, shows that significant upgrades are required to the system. The proponent needs to investigate water usage (and wastewater generation) reduction options through efficiency measures and production throughput reduction until such time as the required upgrades and new evaporation ponds are completed. There is significant risk of groundwater and surface water contamination given the location of the Premises and existing infrastructure.

The reissued licence (L7294/1998/11) requires SLFG to address environmental issues at the Premises and commit to increasing the capacity of the effluent treatment system by constructing additional evaporation ponds, through works approval W5107/2011/1. SLFG has also committed to achieve zero wastewater discharge from the Premises by 2016.

Works approval amendment DRAFT 2014:

SLFG has advised DER that under current throughput rates it is incapable of storing effluent within its current infrastructure prior to the completion of Stage 1 of works approval W5107/2011/1. Stages under works approval W5107/2011/1 include:

- Stage 1 Construction and lining of Ponds 7 and 8 (formerly referred to as Ponds 12 and 13 in the works approval application). Completion is anticipated for late October 2014;
- Stage 2 Construction of pond 9 (formerly pond 14).

This works approval amendment will allow for a staged approach to works approval compliance, enabling SLFG to discharge final effluent to Ponds 7 and 8 once lined and ahead of Stage 2 completion. Although this was the original intention of the works approval, condition G5 did not enable such an approach.

As Pond 7 and 8 were originally designed to overflow into Pond 9, SLFG has requested to remove the requirement for spillways to be constructed on Ponds 7 and 8 to increase the storage capacity of the evaporation ponds and reduce the likelihood of a pond overflow.

Finally, an extension to the works approval has been requested to allow SLFG time to investigate alternative methods for disposing treated effluent in place of completing Stage 2 of the works approval. However, as these alternatives have not been assessed or approved by DER, SLFG wishes to hold the works approval open to allow for the construction of the final evaporation pond should DER not accept future proposals.

An amendment to licence L7294/1998/11 will be required to allow SLFG to accept up to 2.5 ML of effluent from the Myrup Truck Wash and Liquid Waste Facility (L8793/2013/1) to Pond 8 as per an agreement with the Shire of Esperance and assessed under licence L7294/1998/11. Amendments will also be required to allow the operation of Ponds 7 and 8.
